Let your child read the scripture on his or her own. Follow it up with the reading of the illustrations or the explanations given in the book.

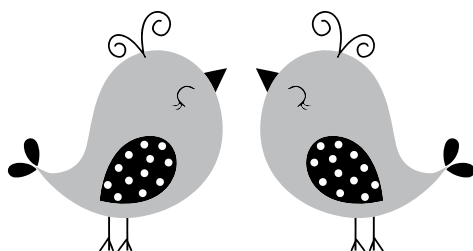
Ask your child to explain or tell you what he or she understands by the scripture and the illustration given.

THEME: LESSONS FROM RUTH

TOPIC: BEING HARDWORKING

BIBLE PASSAGE: RUTH 2:17-19

MEMORY VERSE: *So Ruth gathered barley there all day, and when she beat out the grain that evening, it filled an entire basket. Ruth 2:17, NLT*

Elimelech and Naomi and their two sons – Mahlon and Chilion – lived in Bethlehem in Judah. There was a famine in Judah. Elimelech and his family, therefore, moved from Bethlehem to Moab. Ruth and Orpah were young women from Moab who got married to the sons of Elimelech and Naomi. Ruth and Orpah lived together with their in-laws.

After a while, Naomi lost her husband and two sons, so she decided to return to her native land, Judah. While Ruth made up her mind to follow her mother-in-law, Orpah, the other daughter-in-law of Naomi, decided to return to Moab.

The barley harvest was just beginning when Naomi and Ruth got to Bethlehem, in Judah. Boaz, a very rich and influential member of the family of Elimelech had a barley field. Ruth went to work in the field of this rich man. Ruth worked so hard in the barley field, never

relaxing. Boaz showed her kindness by allowing her to work with her harvesters. She went on gathering grain in the field until evening and when she had beaten it out, she found, she had nearly 10 kilograms.

Children, we should not be lazy – relaxing in our studies and work at home. Hard work brings a lot of good rewards. The harder we work, the more likely Mummy and Daddy will love us and God will bless us too. Hard work pays off in the end, so let us work hard.

Lesson: Learn to work hard.

Prayer: God, help me work hard at everything I find to do.



DAY 02

THEME: LESSONS FROM RUTH TOPIC: BEING RESPECTFUL

BIBLE PASSAGE: RUTH 2:10-12

MEMORY VERSE: *Ruth bowed down with her face touching the ground, and said to Boaz, "Why should you be so concerned about me? Why should you be so kind to a foreigner?"* Ruth 2:10, GNT

Ruth was a very respectful woman who showed so much humility towards Boaz and honoured him, the first time they met.

How do you behave towards people you have just met for the first time? Do you show respect to them? You can never tell: they may be of great help to you. They may also be the people God may use to bring about a "turn-around" in your life.

Ruth found favour in the sight of Boaz and got married to him—a rich and influential man. This was a great "turn-around" for Ruth. She was no more a poor widow, but a rich man's wife. They had a son whom they named Obed. He became the father of Jesse who also gave birth to David. The poor young woman, Ruth, now a proud mother, married to a rich and influential husband! Children, the people we show respect to may be a source of blessing to us.

Lesson: Show respect to everyone, even those who may not be your friends.

Prayer: Lord God, please give me the spirit of humility to show respect to people who come my way.

THEME: LESSONS FROM ESTHER

TOPIC: BEING OBEDIENT

BIBLE PASSAGE: ESTHER 2:10-12

MEMORY VERSE: *Go gather all the Jews who are present in Shushan and fast for me.* **ESTHER 4:16a**



Esther was a beautiful lady who married King Ahasuerus of the Medo-Persian Empire. Esther was taken care of as an orphan by her senior cousin, called Mordecai, who took her as a daughter. Esther always humbled herself and listened to Mordecai's advice. Mordecai asked her to see the king about a plot by a man called Haman to kill all the Jews. This was a "dangerous mission" because you could not see the king if he had not called you.

Esther sent a message to Mordecai at first: *"All the world knows that anyone, whether man or woman, who goes into the king's inner court without his summons is doomed to die unless the king holds out his gold scepter; and the king has not called for me to come to him in more than a month"* (Esther 4:11, TLB).

However, Esther gathered courage through the prayer support of the Jews and went on the mission. Esther went to see the king about Haman's plot to eliminate the Jews. Haman had promised to put some huge amount of money in the king's treasuries. King Ahasuerus had set Haman's seat above all the princes that were with him.

The Jews, however, got saved as a result

of Esther's obedience to the instructions of Mordecai to see the king.

Children, let us learn to obey the advice and instructions of the elderly, for they will only lead us to safety.

Lesson: Obey the advice and instructions of the elderly.

Prayer: Dear God, please grant me the grace to be obedient to the elderly.

THEME: LESSONS FROM ESTHER

TOPIC: BEING PRAYERFUL

BIBLE PASSAGE: ESTHER 4:15-17

MEMORY VERSE: "Go, gather together all the Jews who are in Susa, and fast for me. Do not eat or drink for three days, night or day. I and my maids will fast as you do. When this is done, I will go to the king, even though it is against the law. And if I perish, I perish." **ESTHER 4:16, NIV**

Esther could never have gone to the king without God's help. As they prayed and fasted, God helped her. Prayer makes possible what is impossible.

No matter how unkind your teacher may be, when you pray, God can touch his or her heart. Let us try to pray when we face challenges rather than panic. The tough situations we face in school can be dealt with through prayer.

Esther was a young girl, who was admired by everyone. She was the daughter of Abihail, a Benjamite, who was an uncle of Mordecai. When Esther's parents died, Mordecai adopted her as his daughter.

Esther was made the queen in place of Vashti and she remained firm in her prayer life. Haman, one of the king's officials, planned to destroy the Jews. Esther ordered that her people, the Jews, fast for three days, so they would be saved from destruction.

No matter how young you are, you have to be prayerful. Prayer works. After the three-day fast, the decision to destroy the Jews was cancelled. Pray about every situation that bothers you and God will, surely, see you through.

Lesson: Learn to pray about every situation.

Prayer: Lord, help me to put my whole trust in You alone about every situation.

THEME: LESSONS FROM ESTHER

TOPIC: BEING COURAGEOUS

BIBLE PASSAGE: ESTHER 5:1-5

MEMORY VERSE: *Now it happened, on the third day of her fast, Esther put on her royal robes and went and stood in the inner courtyard of the palace, facing the throne room. ESTHER 5:1*

Esther was such a courageous woman: She knew it was most risky going to the king when he had not called her, but she went in to see him anyway. The king received her kindly and did not kill her.

One rule that was well known in the province of Persia was that, if anyone -- man or woman -- went into the inner courtyard to see the king without being summoned, that person had to die (Esther 4:11). Everyone -- from the king's advisers to the people in the provinces -- knew that and Esther knew that too. But after Esther had fasted together with her people for three days, she gathered the courage to go and see the king. Esther was such a courageous woman.

God will always grant us His favour when we are courageous. So, take a bold step today and

believe He will give you success. He will give you success in your examinations and in whatever else you do.

Lesson: Do not be afraid to take bold steps, after you have prayed.

Prayer: Lord, please give me the courage to obey You in all situations, so that I will succeed in everything I do.



THEME: LESSONS FROM HANNAH

TOPIC: PERSISTENCE IN PRAYER

BIBLE PASSAGE: SAMUEL 1:15-17

MEMORY VERSE: *Do not take your servant for a wicked woman;
I have been praying here out of great anguish and grief.*
1 SAMUEL 1:16, NIV

Elkanah had two wives: Hannah and Peninnah. Peninnah had children, but Hannah had none. Each time Elkanah offered his sacrifice at Shiloh, he would give one share of the meat to Peninnah, equally giving one share to each of her children. Because he loved Hannah very much, he would give her a double portion (1 Samuel 1:5).

Hannah did not have a child, so she prayed fervently to God. She knew God would give her a baby. Hannah prayed earnestly at Shiloh. She prayed so much that the priest Eli thought she was drunk. God, indeed, heard her and she had a baby boy and named him Samuel.

Do not give up yet; just continue to pray.

Lesson: Pray! Pray! Pray about every situation!

Prayer: Dear God, please grant me the grace to keep on praying, no matter how hopeless the situation may look.

THEME: LESSONS FROM HANNAH

TOPIC: BUILDING YOUR FAITH IN GOD

BIBLE PASSAGE: SAMUEL 1:18-20

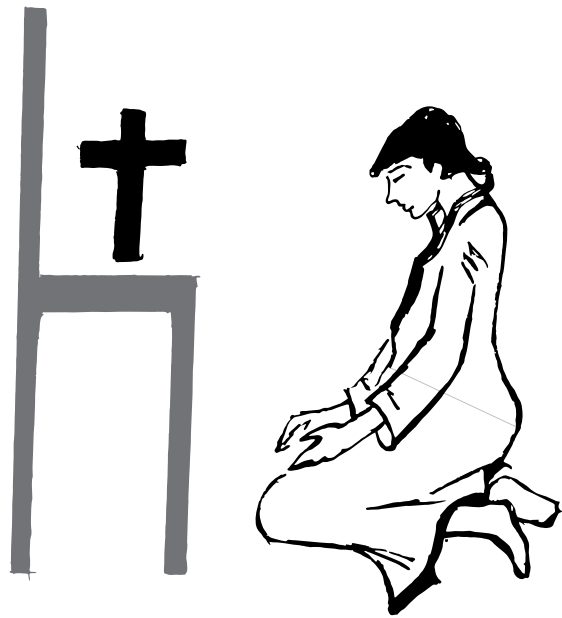
MEMORY VERSE: *"May you always think kindly of me," she replied. Then she went away, ate some food, and was no longer sad.*
1 SAMUEL 1:18, GNT

Peninnah teased and humiliated Hannah. Hannah built up her faith in God through prayer. When Eli the priest encouraged her, asking her to go in peace because the God of Israel would answer her prayer, she believed He would surely do it. She, therefore, went her way and ate and was no longer sad. This truly showed that Hannah believed God would surely answer her prayer and bless her with a child.

When we pray, let us believe that God will give us answers. Our prayers always have to be backed by faith. Believe God can bless you with whatever position you are desiring to be in class and answer any other prayer. He can do everything. Just pray consistently about your desires and God will surely grant them.

Lesson: God will truly honour His Word.

THEME: LESSONS FROM HANNAH TOPIC: GOD WILL ANSWER YOUR PRAYER

BIBLE PASSAGE: SAMUEL 1:19-20

MEMORY VERSE: "... and in due time she gave birth to a son. She named him Samuel, for she said, "I asked the Lord for him."

1 SAMUEL 1:20, NLT

When we build our faith in prayer, we need to equally expect that God will surely answer our prayer. After Hannah's fervent prayer, she was blessed with a son, whom she named Samuel. She also had many other children (1 Samuel 2:5). Finally, it became so obvious that God had heard and answered Hannah's prayers.

What have you asked God for? Are you still praying about it? Do you have faith that God will answer you? Relax, for your answer will surely come. Sometimes, it will take days, or months; at other times, even longer still. However, whatever the case may be, God will, surely, answer. Have faith in Him.

Lesson: Always believe that God will answer your prayers.

Prayer: I thank You, Lord, for answering every prayer according to Your will and in Your time.

JOB 5:19



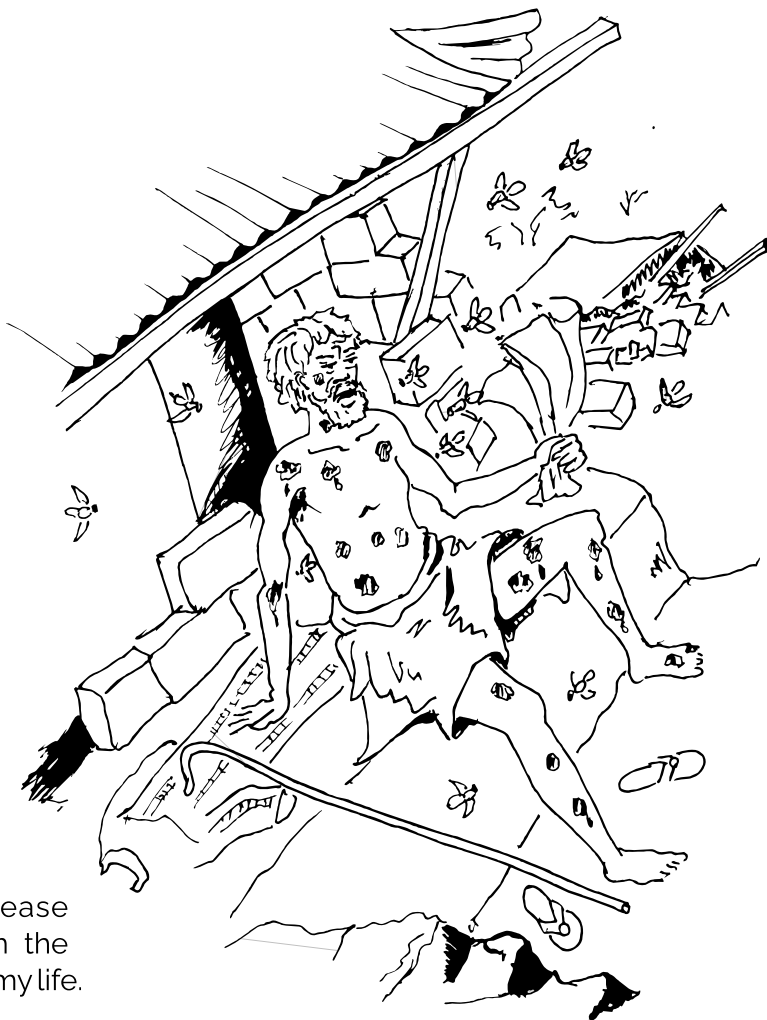

Can God truly say about you, that you are upright? Can God truly say of you that you are living a life that pleases Him? How wonderful it would be if God could say this about you.

Job was so upright that God could trust him to stand firm in the face of temptation. If your friends try to tempt you into sinning, can you stand against or resist them? DAY 11

THEME: LESSONS FROM JOB

TOPIC: FLEE FROM LUST

BIBLE PASSAGE: JOB 31:1-4

MEMORY VERSE: *I made a covenant with my eyes not to look lustfully at a girl. JOB 31:1, NIV*



A covenant means a strong agreement that should not be broken. Job made a covenant with his eyes that he would never lust after a girl. "To lust for (after)" means either "desiring strongly" or "yearning" so much for "what normally does not belong to you legally". The word "lust" refers mostly to the yearning immorally for the opposite sex: someone you are not married to.

What has been described as lust is sinful and indulging in it always leads to disgrace. Let us wait patiently for the right time when we are fully matured and working to get married before we involve ourselves in what is only meant for married couples. Lust can finally lead you into pre-marital sex and God hates fornication.

Let us learn to keep ourselves pure as children and God will be pleased with us.

Lesson: Run away from lust (bad desires).

Prayer: Lord, please, protect me from the spirit of lust.

THEME: LESSONS FROM MARY TOPIC: REMAINING CHASTE

BIBLE PASSAGE: MATTHEW 1:22-25

MEMORY VERSE: *Behold the virgin shall be with child and bear a son and they shall call his name Immanuel, which is translated God with us.*
MATTHEW 1:23

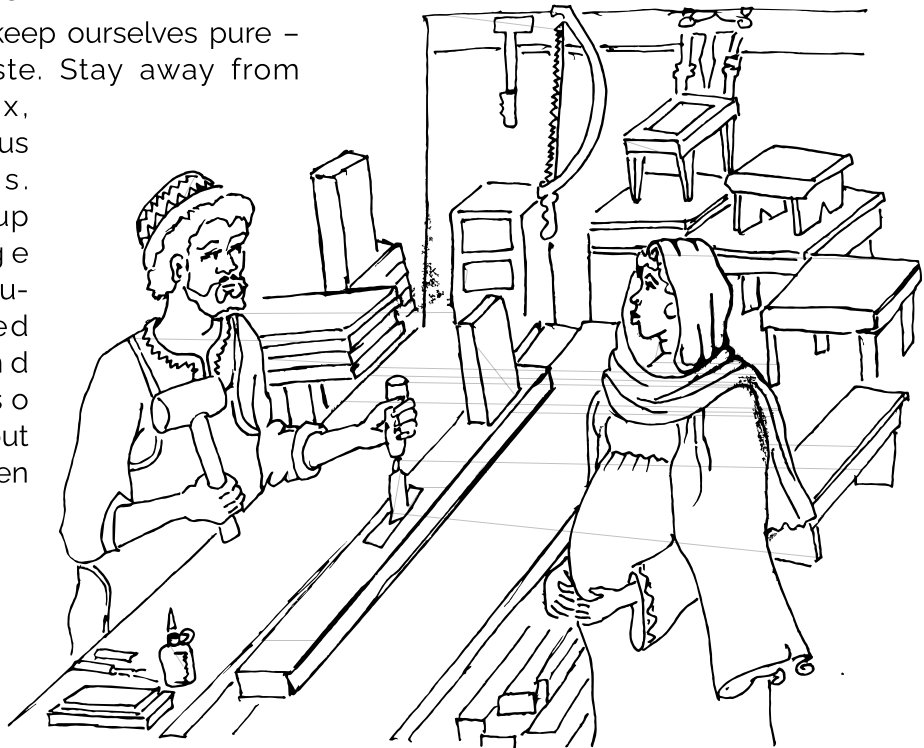
Mary was a virgin at the time she became pregnant with Jesus through the Holy Spirit. Mary was chaste or pure: she never fornicated with Joseph, the man she was engaged to. Her ability to keep herself pure pleased the Lord so much. It is so clear that Mary would not have been the right candidate to conceive Jesus if she had not been a virgin.

Let us learn to keep ourselves pure – remaining chaste. Stay away from premature sex, which has serious consequences. You may end up with teenage pregnancy, sexually-transmitted diseases and equally also become a dropout from school. When you live a life of purity, God will honour you. Living a life of chastity also promotes good health. God blesses

you for remaining chaste as a young person.

Lesson: Abstain from premarital sex or fornication because of the very serious dangers involved.

Prayer: Our Heavenly Father, please keep me pure and free from sexual immorality.



THEME: LESSONS FROM MARY

TOPIC: HUMILITY

BIBLE PASSAGE: LUKE 1:34-38

MEMORY VERSE: *Then Mary said, "Behold the maidservant of the Lord. Let it be to me according to your word. And the angel departed from her."*
LUKE 1:38

Mary was a young woman, who was promised in marriage to a man named Joseph, who was from the family of King David. She was not yet married to Joseph.

One day, an angel came to Mary and told her she would become pregnant and give birth to a baby who would be called Jesus. Mary accepted the message in humility, although she was a virgin. She was prepared to accept whatever God wanted to do in her life. Why? The reason was that she knew God's plan was always the best.

We need to humbly accept who we are. We should believe that whatever God allows to come our way is the best. Mary, out of humility, accepted God's will for her to give birth to the Savior Jesus.

Humility is always the key to accepting what is best from the Almighty God.

Lesson: Be humble.

Prayer: O Lord, help me to walk by faith and in humility, to receive the very best from You.



THEME: LESSONS FROM MARY

TOPIC: SHOWING APPRECIATION TO GOD & WORSHIPPING HIM

BIBLE PASSAGE: LUKE 1:46-49

MEMORY VERSE: *For he took notice of his lowly servant girl, and from now on all generations will call me blessed. LUKE 1:48, NLT*

Mary left hurriedly after her visitation by the angel, to the town in the hill country of Judea to visit Elizabeth. Being filled with the Holy Spirit, Elizabeth said in a loud voice on seeing Mary, "You are the most blessed of all women and blessed is the child you will bear." Mary was full of gratitude and showed appreciation to the Almighty God for choosing her as the vessel for the delivery of such a wonderful baby.

When God does what is truly good for us – bringing a miracle our way -- let us show appreciation to Him. Let us always worship God sincerely. In the process of being thankful to

Him, it is good to tell Him, "Lord, You have never withheld your goodness and mercies from me. I am ever so very grateful to you." Be grateful to God for all He does, no matter how small it is. Thank Him that you are enjoying another day. Be grateful for both the food you eat and the lives of your parents.

Lesson: If you call the Almighty God your Heavenly Father, you have much more reason to be thankful, for, above all, you are His child!

Prayer: Father, may I ever thank, praise and worship You.

DAY 15

Ezekiel was a prophet in his time. God gave him a mission to send His Word to the people of Israel who were so rebellious. They did not respect God and were stubborn (Ezekiel 2:4).

There are friends in our class, community and church who may be very stubborn and will not take any correction. We are not to give up on such friends. Let us continue to share the Word of God with them. He will help them turn from their stubborn ways.

We also have to share our testimonies with them over how God has been faithful to us ever since we gave our lives to Christ. They may also have the desire to give their lives to Christ and change from their bad ways.

Lesson: Share Christ with someone today.

Prayer: Please, Lord, grant me your grace to share your Word with my unsaved friends to draw them to You.

THEME: LESSONS FROM EZEKIEL TOPIC: SHARING THE WORD OF GOD WITHOUT FEAR

BIBLE PASSAGE: EZEKIEL 3:4-9

MEMORY VERSE: *Now I will make you as stubborn and as tough as they are. I will make you as firm as a rock, as hard as a diamond, don't be afraid of those rebels. GNT EZEKIEL 3:8-9*

The people of Israel were very stubborn. Ezekiel, thus, had to be very firm in his desire to share the Word of God with them. In the same manner, you should not give up on your stubborn friends. THEME: LESSONS FROM EZEKIEL TOPIC: LIVING A FREE LIFE FROM REBELLION

BIBLE PASSAGE: EZEKIEL 2:7-10

MEMORY VERSE: *But you, son of man, hear what I say to you. Do not be rebellious like that rebellious house, open your mouth and eat what I give you.* **EZEKIEL 2:8**

God advised Ezekiel never to be as stubborn as the Israelites. The only way to do this was to be filled with the Word of God.

In our efforts to share the Word of God with our friends, so they will no more be stubborn, we should also make sure that we know the Word of God pretty well. DAY 18

THEME: LESSONS FROM NEHEMIAH

TOPIC: PRAYING FOR OTHERS

BIBLE PASSAGE: NEHEMIAH 1:1-4

MEMORY VERSE: *So it was, when I heard these words that I sat down and wept, and mourned for many days, I was fasting and praying before the God of heaven. NEHEMIAH 1:4*

Nehemiah had a great concern for his fellow Jews who had returned from exile in Babylonia. Those who had survived and were back in the homeland were in great difficulty and the foreigners, who lived nearby, looked down on them. Another concern he had was that, the walls of Jerusalem and the gates, had still not been restored since the time they were burnt down. He decided not to just sit unconcerned as if he was not affected. Instead, he prayed for the salvation of the people of Israel. He prayed that God would come in to deliver His people.

We should always desire to help those who are in trouble. Do not just stand aloof and watch people go through pain. Help, if you can, and pray always for such people.

Nehemiah prayed for his people who were the children of Israel. He fasted and prayed day and night. He trusted that God would forgive the sins of the Israelites. We can also pray for our friends. We can trust God to heal them when they are sick; for their financial needs to be met, etc., etc.

Lesson: Pray for others.

Prayer: O, God, may I always pray for my friends – trusting You to meet all their needs.

THEME: LESSONS FROM NEHEMIAH TOPIC: BEING WISE

BIBLE PASSAGE: NEHEMIAH 2:11-13

MEMORY VERSE: *Then I arose in the night, I and a few men with me; I told no one what my God had put in my heart to do at Jerusalem; nor was there any animal with me, except the one on which I rode.*
NEHEMIAH 2:12

We do not always have to reveal our plans and dreams to our friends. We need to learn to keep such dreams to ourselves. Some friends may fight against us, if we tell them our beautiful dreams. Such friends may do whatever they can to stop people who may be willing to help us from doing so.

Keep your dream to yourself and always pray about it until you see God bring it to pass.

When Nehemiah sought to help his fellow Jews, he did not tell anyone what God had put in his heart. He was very wise. Someone could have gone ahead

to fight him and prevent him from achieving what God wanted him to. Remember what happened to Joseph when he revealed his dreams to his brothers -- they sold him into slavery. Keep your plans secret. Keep your ideas to yourself until it is time for God to use you for His purpose. Be wise like Nehemiah.

Lesson: Keep your plans and ideas secret from your friends, until God's time to fulfil them is due.

Prayer: God, help me not to be careless about the beautiful plans and ideas You give me by revealing it to people carelessly.



THEME: LESSONS FROM NEHEMIAH

TOPIC: SEEKING WISDOM TO CHOOSE THE RIGHT PEOPLE TO PLAY RESPONSIBLE ROLES

BIBLE PASSAGE: NEHEMIAH 7:1-3

MEMORY VERSE: *I gave the responsibility of governing Jerusalem to my brother Hanani and to Hananiah, the commander of the fortress - a very faithful man who revered God more than most people do.* **NEHEMIAH 7:2**

After Nehemiah had accomplished his vision of getting the walls of Jerusalem built, he sought to get people to put in charge of governing the town. One of the people he selected was Hananiah. Hananiah feared God more than most people did.

Let us always make sure that we give roles to people who fear God. When you want to select anyone among your friends to help you undertake any task, always choose those who fear God. People, who fear God, will always make sure your efforts do not go down the drain. People, who fear God, always want the well-being of others and so handle roles with a great sense of responsibility. People who fear God are also not deceitful. People who fear God are humble too.

Lesson: Always make the right choice: "Choose a God-fearing person" for any task.

Prayer: God, help me to make the right choice when selecting a person for a task.

DAY 21

THEME: LESSONS FROM NEHEMIAH TOPIC: GOD CAN HELP US ACHIEVE OUR GOALS

BIBLE PASSAGE: NEHEMIAH 2:18-20

MEMORY VERSE: *So I answered them, and said to them, "The God of heaven Himself will prosper us, therefore we His servants will arise and build but you have no heritage or right or memorial in Jerusalem."* **NEHEMIAH 2:20, NKJV**

When Nehemiah and others started to build, Sanballat, Tobiah and Geshem tried to make fun of them. Although they were despised by the others, Nehemiah was never discouraged. He believed he would accomplish his dream by the help of God, and the walls of Jerusalem would surely be built.

THEME: LESSONS FROM DANIEL

TOPIC: DETERMINE NOT TO COMPROMISE

BIBLE PASSAGE: DANIEL 1:6-8

MEMORY VERSE: *But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank, therefore did he request of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself.* **DANIEL 1:8**

In the third year that Jehoaikim was king of Judah, King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon attacked Jerusalem and surrounded the city. In addition to what was valuable that he took, he ordered that his chief official select some young men from both the royal and noble families who were handsome, intelligent, well trained, quick to learn and free from physical defects. They would be qualified to serve in the royal court. Among the young men chosen were Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael and Azaria whose names were later changed to Belteshazzar, Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, respectively.

These young men pleaded with the guard in charge to provide them with vegetables and water alone for ten days, instead of the food from the king's table. When time was up, they looked healthier and stronger than all those who had been eating the royal food.

Daniel feared God and loved Him with all his heart, so he decided he would never do what would displease Him. He was not afraid of what the king might do to him: he simply would not sin against God. He and his friends refused to eat anything that was going to defile them.

We have to stand for the Lord, no matter the situation. Never compromise on your Christian standards. Then God will surely grant you His favour.

Lesson: Never be interested in what is worldly (for example, secular music, indecent dressing, etc.) - compromising as a Christian.

Prayer: Lord God, help me never to compromise on my Christian standards.



THEME: LESSONS FROM DANIEL

TOPIC: BEING GUIDED BY WISDOM

BIBLE PASSAGE: DANIEL 2:13-16

MEMORY VERSE: *So Daniel went in and asked the king to give him time that he might tell the king the interpretation. DANIEL 2:16*

Nebuchadnezzar, king of Babylon, had a dream that worried him so much. None of his fortune-tellers, magicians, sorcerers and wizards could either tell or explain the dream to him. The king became very angry over this and ordered the execution of all his royal advisors in Babylon. Daniel then went to the guard who had been ordered to carry out the executions. Choosing his words very carefully, Daniel asked for the reason for such a harsh order. Then he sought permission for some days to wait on God. Daniel and his friends prayed and that same night the mystery was revealed. If Daniel had not chosen steps of wisdom ("choosing his words very carefully" and asking for permission for some time to wait on God), he, along with his friends and other officials, would have been killed by the executioners.

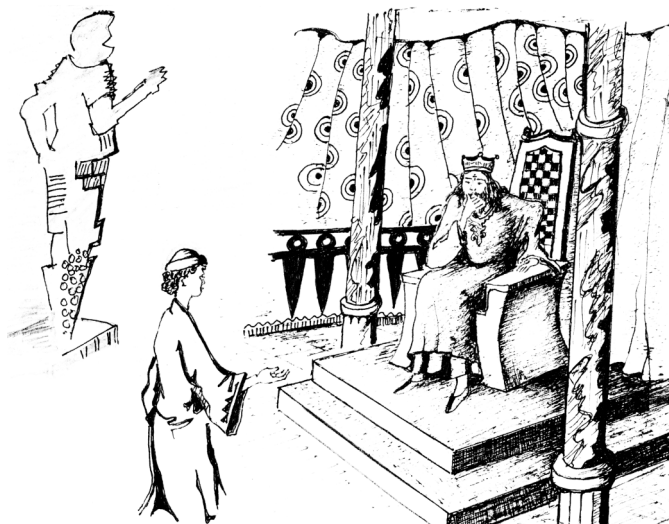
We always need wisdom when challenges come our way. Daniel needed wisdom to come up with what could convince the king to be patient, in his decision to execute him and his friends along with the rest of the wise men in Babylon. Daniel was such a wise young man. Again, he never prayed alone

about the issue; he asked his friends to join him in doing so. Wisdom is one of the keys that can save you from trouble. God surely did reveal the amazing secret about the king's dream concerning future kingdoms to Daniel in the night vision.

Lessons:

- Seek counsel from God before you make every difficult decision.
- Pray to God for wisdom to solve every difficult problem.

Prayer: Lord God, please give me wisdom.



DAY 24

THEME: LESSONS FROM JOSHUA

TOPIC: BEING COURAGEOUS

BIBLE PASSAGE: JOSHUA 1:7-9

MEMORY VERSE: *Only be strong and very courageous that you may observe to do according to all the law which my servant commanded you. Do not turn from it to the right or to the left that you may prosper wherever you go.* **JOSHUA 1:7**

Joshua, son of Nun, was Moses' helper. After Moses died, Joshua was instructed to lead the people of Israel to cross the River Jordan into the land they had been given. God asked Joshua to be confident and determined: never to be discouraged.

Without confidence, you can never achieve whatever is great. Do not be afraid to take bold steps to achieve your goals, no matter the challenges. God will always be there to help you. You have to be courageous when you are put in a leadership position in class, church and in your community. We need courage to implement our visions in life.

Lesson: Do not be afraid to attempt any task you believe God wants you to do. Write your examinations and do your assignments with courage.

THEME: LESSONS FROM JOSHUA

THEME: LESSONS FROM JOSHUA

TOPIC: MAKING A GOOD ASSESSMENT BEFORE TAKING ANY STEP

BIBLE PASSAGE: JOSHUA 2:1-4

MEMORY VERSE: *Now, Joshua son of Nun sent out two men from Acacia Grove to spy secretly saying; view the land especially Jericho. JOSHUA 2:1*

It is always important to assess any task to find out if you can handle it, before you even begin it.

Unfortunately, the land the Israelites were asked to occupy already had some people living on it. Joshua, therefore, had to send two men to go and assess the inhabitants living in the land: their stature, lifestyle, religion, etc. This was to make sure that they would be able to fight the inhabitants and gain victory. Secondly, the assessment was to also help them make the necessary preparation before going out to war.

Lesson: Always try to assess yourself by answering a few test questions before attempting any examination at school.

Prayer: Lord, grant me wisdom to make a "fair assessment" of myself before any examination or task.



THEME: LESSONS FROM SAMUEL
TOPIC: TAKING UP RESPONSIBILITY

BIBLE PASSAGE: 1 SAMUEL 7:14-17

MEMORY VERSE: Samuel continued as Israel's judge for the remainder of his life. 1 SAMUEL 7:15



Samuel always prayed to God on behalf of the Israelites. The towns from Ekron to Gath that the Philistines had captured from Israel were restored to Israel. There was peace between the Israelites and the Amorites. He continued as Israel's judge all his life.

Have you taken up any responsibility in your school? Are you playing any role in the church? Accept any responsibility you may be given and work hard in the role you choose. Make sure you make a good impact in the lives of people. Any responsibility you are given at school should be helpful to everyone there. You can do this effectively if you are selfless, hardworking and God-fearing. Make sure you make a very positive impact in your generation by playing your role with diligence. You will build a strong reputation for yourself.

Lesson: Play any role you have been given in either school or church very well. Work hard to achieve greatness.

Prayer: Grant me Your grace, Lord, to perform any responsibility I am given very well.

THEME: LESSONS FROM SAMUEL

TOPIC: DO NOT BE GREEDY

THEME: LESSONS FROM SAMUEL

TOPIC: SEEKING ADVICE FROM THE LORD

BIBLE PASSAGE: 1 SAMUEL 8:6-9

MEMORY VERSE: *Samuel was terribly upset and went to the Lord for advice.*
1 SAMUEL 8:6

Sometimes, in life, we may find ourselves at crossroads - confused about what decision to take. We may also feel upset and may not know what to do next. In any of these situations, we need to go to God in prayer. We need to ask God what exactly we should do. It is always safe to know God's will at every point in time to avoid mistakes.

THEME: LESSONS DRAWN FROM TIMOTHY

TOPIC: ALLOWING TO BE MENTORED

BIBLE PASSAGE: 1 TIMOTHY 1:1-4

MEMORY VERSE: *To Timothy, my true son in the faith, may God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord give you grace, mercy and peace. 1 TIMOTHY 1:2*

Paul, an apostle of Jesus Christ, took Timothy and mentored or guided him. He taught Timothy, giving him good advice – enabling the young man to handle his own personal ministry. He guided Timothy in so many ways by giving him very valuable pieces of advice.

Do you have a mentor? Besides our biological parents, we also need to have another adult who can mentor and guide us: This is quite needful, especially because it enables us to make important decisions. We can choose our mentors from among either the set of teachers in our schools, or good adults in our churches and communities. Our mentors need to be God-fearing.

Lesson: Trust God to give you a mentor.

Prayer: Lord God, please lead me to the right person to mentor me.



THEME: LESSONS ABOUT JESUS TOPIC: JESUS, THE TRUE SON OF GOD

BIBLE PASSAGE: MATTHEW 1:18-20

MEMORY VERSE: *This is how Jesus the Messiah was born. His mother, Mary, was engaged to be married to Joseph. But before the marriage took place, while she was still a virgin, she became pregnant through the power of the Holy Spirit. MATTHEW 1:18, NLT*

Jesus is the true Son of God. The Bible makes it clear that Mary became pregnant through the power of the Holy Spirit. It means Jesus was not an ordinary man: He was God. It is, therefore, easy to put your trust in Him. He is your Healer, Provider, Comforter and Helper. Go to Him in prayer anytime you need help. He is truly the Son of God and He never fails. He is God, so He can perform miracles.

When you have difficulties in your studies, go to Jesus and He will help you. If you are seriously ill, trust God: He will, surely, bring about a supernatural healing. If you are struggling with sin – doing bad stuff and not doing the good you know you should do -- ask Jesus to help you. He will clean you through the power in the blood He shed on Calvary's cross. He will also help you to overcome every sin.

Lesson: Anytime you need help, you can put your trust in Jesus. Through prayer, you will receive your answer.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, I commit every difficult situation in my life to You. I have complete trust in You that you can deal with each one of them.

THEME: LESSONS ABOUT JESUS

TOPIC: JESUS THE HEALER

BIBLE PASSAGE: MATTHEW 9:20-22

MEMORY VERSE: *But Jesus turned around and when he saw her, he said, "Be of good cheer, daughter, your faith has made you well." And the woman was made well from that hour.* **MATTHEW 9:22**

Jesus heals, and, in fact, He can do so instantly. The woman in the scripture of Matthew 9:22 had been ill for twelve years, but she got healed by Jesus, instantly. Are you suffering from any sickness like asthma or sickle cell? Believe that Jesus is the Healer. He can, most surely, heal you. Jesus only expects you to have faith. The woman had suffered from severe bleeding for twelve years. When she decided to see Jesus, she went up behind Him and touched the edge of His cloak. Pray for healing for your friends, parents and siblings through Jesus Christ and they will surely receive their healing. Only have faith!

Lesson: Always pray to Jesus whenever you or anyone you know is sick. They will surely be healed.

Prayer: Lord Jesus, heal me of every sickness in my body.



THEME: LESSONS FROM JOSEPH

TOPIC: LEARNING TO BE EARNEST

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 37:1-3

MEMORY VERSE: *Jacob's son Joseph was now seventeen years old. His job, along with his half-brothers, the sons of his father's wives Bilhah and Zilpah was to shepherd his father's flocks. But Joseph reported to his father some of the bad things they were doing.* **GENESIS 37:2**

Joseph's brothers disliked him, but God loved him so much. Joseph never compromised -- he did not join his siblings in wrongdoing. He rather reported to his father "some of the bad things" that the brothers were doing and that brought him favour with both God and his father.

It is always important we do not conceal any wrongdoings of both our siblings and friends, either in school or at home. It could be an unnecessary disturbance in class, bullying of other colleagues, stealing items and so on. Report them to the right person, so such wrongdoers can be disciplined. They might dislike you, but God will reward you. Joseph always spoke the truth. He never took part in the wrongdoings of his brothers.

Lesson: Be bold enough to expose every wrongdoing in either your class or home.

Prayer: Lord God, please help me to be an earnest person. Let me never be afraid to always speak the truth.



THEME: LESSONS FROM JOSEPH

TOPIC: LIVING AN UPRIGHT LIFE

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 39:6-10

MEMORY VERSE: *She kept putting pressure on Joseph day after day, but he refused to sleep with her, and he kept out of her way as much as possible.* **GENESIS 39:10, NLT**

Joseph feared God. He loved the commandments of God and desired to follow them day and night. Joseph knew God's commandment which said, "Do not commit adultery". He determined never to sleep with Potiphar's wife.

Potiphar's wife told a lie about Joseph, that he rather wanted to sleep with her. Joseph was put in prison, but God was with Joseph even in prison.

Our friends may tease us that we are fools because we do not get involved in some of "their bad habits". However, we should know that when we live upright lives, we would surely be honoured at last. If Joseph had slept with Potiphar's wife, it would have brought him shame.

Sin can result in premature death. You can contract a sexually-transmitted disease as a result of sexual immorality. We may also lose the opportunity to be leaders in either our schools or communities, if we are noted to be living ungodly lifestyles.

Lesson: Learn to live a life that honours God always.

Prayer: Almighty Father, please help me to bury any ungodly lifestyle in me and live a life that honours you.

THEME: LESSONS FROM JOSEPH TOPIC: BEING HARDWORKING

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 41:46-49

MEMORY VERSE: *During those years, Joseph gathered all the crops grown in Egypt and stored the grain from the surrounding fields in the cities.* **GENESIS 41:48, NLT**

The king of Egypt had a dream and Joseph showed him the meaning. The dream finally came to pass. Remember that Joseph was sent to prison after Potiphar's wife had falsely accused him of desiring to sleep with her. However, because of Joseph's faithfulness even in prison, he was called to interpret Pharaoh's dreams. He had earlier interpreted the dream of the king's cupbearer and baker. There were seven years of plenty, meaning, the land produced abundant crops. There was so much corn like the sand of the sea. Joseph stored some of it from the fields around. He carefully measured out what had to be stored up for survival during the famine. If Joseph had not worked hard, the seven years of famine would have killed many people and animals too. You always have to work hard at whatever task you are given.

Lesson: Learn to work hard at every task you are given.

Prayer: Father, I present every task I have been given before you. Help me work hard at them.

THEME: LESSONS FROM JOSEPH TOPIC: LOVING YOUR BROTHER

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 44:1-2

MEMORY VERSE: *Joseph commanded the servant in charge of his house, "Fill the men's sacks with as much food as they can carry and put each man's money on top of his sack."* **GENESIS 44:1, GNB**

Joseph had finally become the governor of Egypt. There, indeed, came the seven years of famine. He had stored up a lot of food for survival.

Joseph's brothers also visited Egypt to buy food. Joseph ordered his servants: "Fill the men's sacks with as much food as they can carry, and put each man's money on top of his sack". Joseph, indeed, showed such great love to his brothers, although they sold him into slavery.

DAY 46

THEME: COVENANT KEEPING GOD

TOPIC: GOD IS ALWAYS FAITHFUL

BIBLE PASSAGE: DEUTERONOMY 7:8-9

MEMORY VERSE: *Know therefore that the Lord your God is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who love him and his commandments, to a thousand generations.* **DEUTERONOMY 7:9**

We have to love the Word of God and yearn to keep His commandments. He will be faithful to us, if we obey Him fully.

Lesson: Do your best to love God and live up to His standards.

Prayer: Almighty Father, I pray that you help me obey Your commandments, so that I can experience Your faithfulness.

THEME: SIN

TOPIC: SIN CUTS US OFF FROM GOD'S GLORY

BIBLE PASSAGE: ROMANS 3:22-24

MEMORY VERSE: *For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.*
ROMANS 3:13, NIV

Sin is whatever displeases the Lord. It makes us fall short of God's glory. There is a glory that covers us as children of God. THEME: SIN

TOPIC: SIN MAKES GOD HIDE HIS FACE FROM US

BIBLE PASSAGE: ISAIAH 59:1-2

MEMORY VERSE: *It is because of your sins that he doesn't hear you. It is your sins that separate you from God when you try to worship him.* **ISAIAH 59:2, GNT**

God hates sin and anytime we sin, He hides His face from us as children. God really loves children, but He cannot go against His own Word of "hiding" His face from us when we sin against Him. If you want to be closer to God as a child, live a life that honours Him.

Sin can be both "sweet" and "attractive", but it will always "push" God away from you. It is simply terrible when God moves away from us. For, He is the source of our strength and provides us with all our needs -- giving us on that account, good health, protection and joy.

If God were not close to us, we would not experience the joy of fellowshiping with Him. Our lives would not be complete without God. You just simply would not want to miss a warm daily friendship with God because of sin! There is so much in God: peace, joy, protection, greatness, long life, etc. God can do every good that we desire. What you need to do is to get closer to Him.

Lesson: Do not let sin steal the warm friendship and fellowship you have with God.

Prayer: God, help me always to live a life that honours You.

THEME: SIN

TOPIC: SIN AND ITS CONSEQUENCES ON MAN

BIBLE PASSAGE: ROMANS 6:21-23

MEMORY VERSE: *The wages of sin is death but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.* **ROMANS 6:23**

The Bible says when we sin, the end result is death. That means, we can die spiritually too just as well as this could happen physically. One way of experiencing physical death can be especially through premarital sex, by contracting its related transmitted infections. This can result finally in death.

Spiritually, death can occur when your spirit is weak as a result of sin. You may lose interest in going to church as a result of guilt. You may also lose interest in having your Quiet Time (morning devotion). You equally may not be able to pray or tell others about Christ. etc. When you become "spiritually dead", you also become less active to the promptings of God. This should never happen to us!

We need to be spiritually active. Our lives must please the Lord

because sin is destructive. After every sinful act, there are costs or bad result. One result of sin that the Bible mentions clearly is death - meaning, spiritual death. This is when the individual feels far away from God and is less active to the promptings of the Lord. The individual is then no more sensitive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. One clear sign is loss of the desire to read the Word of God and also prayer. At the beginning the individual is spiritually weak. And, later such an individual

becomes spiritually dead when he or she then loses complete interest in whatever concerns the Lord and, eventually, goes back to the world.

Lesson: Keep away from sin and live for Christ.

Prayer: God, I pray that you always grant me the grace to live a life that honours You.

THEME: SIN

TOPIC: GOD SHOWS US HIS LOVE BY DISCIPLINING US WHEN WE SIN

BIBLE PASSAGE: HEBREWS 12:5-8

MEMORY VERSE: *Because the Lord disciplines those he loves and punishes everyone he accepts as a son.* **HEBREWS 12:6**

No doubt, the Bible makes it clear that God disciplines those He loves. When God loves you, He will do all that is possible to stop you from sinning. He is known to do this for people He truly loves. The Bible says, the wages of sin is death, so why would anyone who truly loves you want to allow you to die? No! He will rather "prune" you that is, make sure that all the negative areas or weaknesses in you life are dealt with. This can be done, sometimes, through disciplining since, quite often, we harden our hearts and refuse to repent. Because God wants to see you in heaven rather than hell, He disciplines you, so that you get a "change of heart".

Let us accept the corrections God directs our way, yearning earnestly to live in ways that honour Him. God truly wants to see then that your life is "enriched" again with prayer, and meditating on His Word after He disciplines you. He wants to see you restart the Christian walk in faith, honouring Him every day and bearing good fruit. God's discipline is never "to push you into sin", but to enable you to ever grow more and more in Him.

Lesson: God loves you, so stop sinning today.

Prayer: Father, please, grant me Your grace to live a life that honours You.

THEME: SIN TOPIC: GOD FORGIVES SIN

BIBLE PASSAGE: 1 JOHN 1:7-10

MEMORY VERSE: *If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.* **1 JOHN 1:9**



Jesus, the only Begotten Son on God, was sent to come and die for us and save us from our sins. God sacrificed His Son purposely because of our sins. What sin, therefore, He can not forgive? THEME: SIN

TOPIC: GOD FORGIVES, NO MATTER HOW BIG THE SIN

BIBLE PASSAGE: PSALM 86:4-7

MEMORY VERSE: *You, Lord, are forgiving and good, abounding in love to all who call to you.* PSALM 86:5

THEME: SIN

TOPIC: THE EFFECT OF UNFORGIVENESS

BIBLE PASSAGE: MATTHEW 18:15-17

MEMORY VERSE: *If a brother sins against you, go to him privately and confront him with his fault. If he listens and confesses it, you have won back a brother.* **MATTHEW 18:15**

The Bible teaches us not to keep the wrongs of others in our hearts. We need to have the confidence to go to those who have offended us to make them aware of how hurt we are. THEME: SIN TOPIC: SIN BRINGS DISGRACE

BIBLE PASSAGE: 2 SAMUEL 13:12-14

MEMORY VERSE: *Where could I go in my shame? And you would be called one of the greatest fools in Israel. Please, just speak to the king about it for he will let you marry me."* **2 SAMUEL 13:13**



The story is about a young man called Amnon who fell in love with his half-sister (step-sister), Tamar. Because they were not married, it was not right for him to sleep with her. He, however, sinned against God by forcibly having sexual intercourse with Tamar.

The Bible says that when Amnon demanded to sleep with Tamar, she told him of the consequences. Obviously, it was going to end in disgrace if he did. And when he raped her, indeed, it resulted in that and a further tragic punishment for Amnon later: Tamar's brother Absalom, after two years, killed Amnon.

Sin always brings disgrace. Whatever wrong is done secretly will be exposed openly by God. It is, therefore, better to avoid living in sin we commit secretly. What can you ever hide from God?

Refrain from sin today and avoid disgrace.

Lesson: Always yearn to avoid sin.

Prayer: Dear God, grant me the grace to live a life of purity, even in secret.

Prayer: Dear God, please strengthen me. Help me live for You and also build up my prayer life.

THEME: THE PARABLES TOPIC: THE PARABLE OF THE SOWER

BIBLE PASSAGE: MARK 4:3-6

MEMORY VERSE: *And some fell on stony ground, where it had not much earth; and immediately it sprang up, because it had no depth in earth.* **MARK 4:5**

Our hearts need to be prepared in such a way that they can receive the true Word of God that comes to us, as well as to also help us grow and bear fruit. One such heart is a repentant heart, a humble heart; and a heart like that of a "little child". Symbolically, the "heart" must have "earth" that is rich in nutrients (the Word of God, prayer, etc.) to enable the Word of God received to remain, grow and bear fruit.

Therefore, a heart, which symbolically does not have much earth, may quickly accept the Word of God, but would, most likely, not grow to expectation and bear fruit. Therefore, the children of God need to have hearts that will easily receive the Word of God, so that it can grow well and yield much fruit.

As children, we need to do our best to keep the Word of God in us by memorizing some constantly. That is the only way we can keep the Word of God and help it bear fruit

Lesson: Constantly memorize the Word of God.

Prayer: Dear Father, help me to always read Your Word, as well as memorize some.

MEMORY VERSE: *And some fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up, and choked it, and it yielded no fruit. MARK 4:7*



Many issues of life, sometimes, hinder us from accepting the Word of God and allowing it to grow in us. Sometimes, unforgiveness, pain, regrets, sin, hurts and many more make it difficult for us to accept the Word of God.

The Word of God, sometimes, sounds untrue to us, when we harbour pain and unforgiveness in our hearts. So, we must let go any hurts, regrets and fears. We must deal with any unforgiveness, pain, etc., in our hearts. In that way, the Word of God can grow in us and also yield fruit. Remember, when we go to heaven, God would like to see what we did for Him on earth. Well, we can do much for Him when we bear good fruit.

Lesson: Search your heart to find out what is serving as a thorn and let go of it.

Prayer: Lord God, please, grant me a pure heart.

THEME: THE PARABLES TOPIC: THE PARABLE OF THE SOWER

BIBLE PASSAGE: MARK 4:8-9

MEMORY VERSE: *And others fell on good ground, and did yield fruit that sprang up and increased; and brought forth, some thirty, and some sixty, and some a hundred.* **MARK 4:8**

Anytime we prepare our hearts well, the Word of God stays in it and bears fruit to the glory of God. We then begin to live lives that please the Lord. We also begin to bear the fruit of the Spirit: *"love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control"* (Galatians 5:22-23, NIV). Let us serve God faithfully.

THEME: THE PARABLES

TOPIC: THE PARABLE OF THE RICH FOOL

BIBLE PASSAGE: LUKE 12:16-21

MEMORY VERSE: *So he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build greater, and there I will store all my crops and my goods. And I will say to my soul, "Soul, you have many goods laid up for many years; take your ease; eat, drink, and be merry."'* **LUKE 12:19**

Lesson: Remember always that whatever you have now is from God and give Him thanks.

THEME: THE PARABLES TOPIC: THE PARABLE OF THE TEN VIRGINS

BIBLE PASSAGE: MATTHEW 25:1-10

MEMORY VERSE: *The foolish ones took their lamps but did not take any oil with them. The wise, however, took oil in jars along with their lamps.* **MATTHEW 25:3-4**

Our God has the power to do all, because He is the Limitless One. He has the power to make your parents rich. He has the power to give you your first choice of school. He has the power to make you great. He has the power to keep you from poor academic performance, etc., etc.

However, all these can be made possible if we plan very well as children so that our desires fall in place with the will of God for our lives. The five wise virgins in the parable had a goal. Their goal was to meet the bridegroom, but they knew equally well that the bridegroom might delay. The five wise virgins prepared adequately to achieve their goal.

Do your maximum best in class: Never be lazy and God will help you achieve your academic, as well as other goals. Always give God the glory for all you have and depend on Him to sustain you. Remember, the foolish ones did not have extra oil and so they could not achieve their desire of meeting the bridegroom.

Always bear in mind that the bridegroom represents Jesus Christ and He will come unannounced. So, it is very necessary that you be prepared at any time.

Lesson: Always live your life as if Christ is coming "TODAY".

Prayer: My Father, help me to work out my salvation with fear and trembling.

THEME: GIVING TOPIC: GIVE TO THE POOR

BIBLE PASSAGE: ACTS 3:3-6

MEMORY VERSE: *Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk."*
ACTS 3:6, NIV



Children, sometimes, you may not have the money, but you can give in kind to a friend. You can give out some of your clean old clothing with your parents' permission. You can also share your food with others who are hungry. You can also spend some of your precious time to pray for them (That is also giving). THEME: LESSONS FROM DAVID

Lesson: Thank God for all His goodness to you.

Prayer: Father God, I thank You for Your goodness, amazing grace and abundant blessings.

THEME: LESSONS FROM ABRAHAM

TOPIC: BELIEVING IN GOD'S PROMISE

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 15:4-6

MEMORY VERSE: *Abraham put his trust in the Lord and because of this the Lord was pleased with him and accepted him.*
GENESIS 15:6

Lesson: Let us show humility anytime we go to God.

THEME: LESSONS FROM ABRAHAM

TOPIC: SHOWING KINDNESS TO OUR FELLOW BROTHER

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 14:12-16

MEMORY VERSE: *When Abraham heard that his nephew had been captured, he called together all the fighting men in his camp, 318 in all and pursued the four kings all the way to Dan. GENESIS 14:14*

There was war in Sodom and Gomorrah where Lot lived. Abraham did not allow his nephew Lot to be killed. He quickly gathered all his men together and rescued him. THEME: LESSONS FROM ABRAHAM

TOPIC: SHOWING KINDNESS TO PEOPLE WE MAY NOT KNOW

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 18:1-5

MEMORY VERSE: *He said, "Sirs, please do not pass by my home without stopping; I am here to serve you."* **GENESIS 18:3**

THEME: LESSONS FROM NOAH TOPIC: PREVAILING OBEDIENCE TO GOD

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 6:15-22

MEMORY VERSE: *Thus Noah did, according to all that God commanded him, so he did.* **GENESIS 6:22**

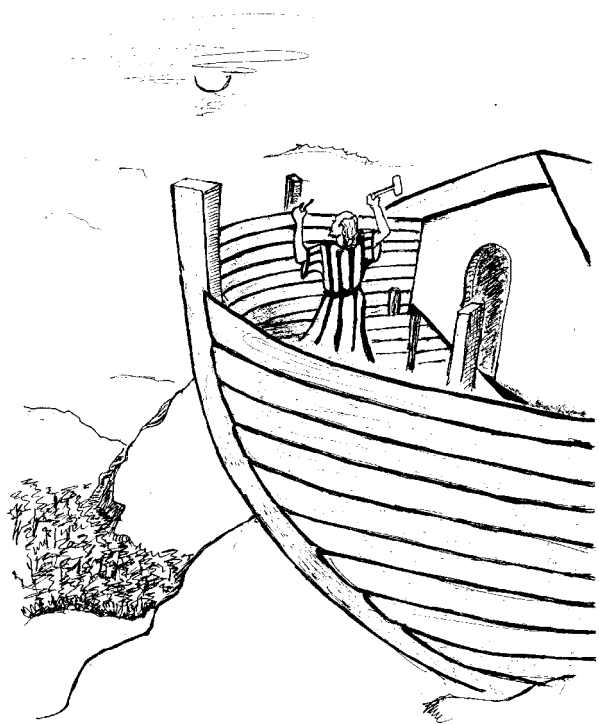
God gave Noah clear instructions as to how to construct the ark and the animals to carry along – mostly two by two – male and female. God also showed him whom to take along – that is, his family members, namely, his wife, three sons and their wives.

Pleasing God brings His blessings and protection. God protected Noah and his family from the floods, because of his obedience. As Christians, God may give us clear instructions as to what to do. He may lead us to either go and share His Word with someone or deliver a message from Him. Whatever instructions God gives, we need to make sure we follow them strictly and He will be pleased with us.

Lesson: Follow every instruction God gives you with all your heart.

Prayer: Father Almighty, I pray for a heart of obedience to follow every instruction you give me. Amen



THEME: LESSONS FROM NOAH

TOPIC: STRIVING TO LIVE A LIFE THAT HONOURS GOD

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 6:9-11

MEMORY VERSE: *This is the account of Noah and his family. Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time and he walked faithfully with God.* **GENESIS 6:9**

THEME: LESSONS FROM NOAH TOPIC: SEEKING WISDOM FOR ALL THAT WE DO

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 8:6-11

MEMORY VERSE: *Then he sent out a raven, which kept going to and fro until the waters had dried up from the earth.* **GENESIS 8:7**

Wisdom is very important in every decision we make in our lives. Noah did not decide to move out of the ark with his family and the numerous animals hastily. He took his time to be sure the water had dried up and the land was, indeed, dry. First of all, he sent out the raven. This is wisdom. We should never take decisions hastily. Let us seek wisdom from God, so that we do not run into any trouble.

According to the account, Noah did not take a hasty decision to move the animals and his family out of the ark. When he realized the land could be dry, he first sent out a raven, which went on flying to and fro for a time until the waters dried up from off the earth. He then sent a dove out of the ark to check whether the waters were abated from the face of the ground. These were both means of using wisdom from God to make decisions.

Lesson: Always seek wisdom from God through His Word and prayer before taking a decision.

Prayer: God Almighty, grant me wisdom in making any decision ahead of me.

THEME: LESSONS FROM NOAH

TOPIC: LEARNING TO BE PATIENT

BIBLE PASSAGE: GENESIS 8:9-12

MEMORY VERSE: *And he waited yet another seven days and again he sent the dove out from the ark.* **GENESIS 8:9**



Noah did not only send out the raven, but waited patiently thereafter for another seven days. Then, he let out the dove also to ensure the land was, indeed, dry from the flood. This was a step and sign of patience which caused Noah to become sure that it was finally safe for the family and all the animals in the ark to move out.

Remember, Noah sent out the dove three times before he finally decided to disembark, along with his family and the animals, from the ark. If they had gone out prematurely -- that is before the floodwaters had dried up - many of the animals could have died.

Therefore, we need to always be patient to be certain before we take every step in life. Being patient in this manner can help prevent danger.

Lesson: Always be patient to hear from God before you make any decision in life.

Prayer: Father Almighty, let me hear from You before I make every decision in life.

On oath, Esau traded away his rights as the firstborn. Jacob gave him bread and the stew of lentils. He ate and drank, got up and left. That's how Esau showed how little he cared about his rights as the firstborn son.

Esau threw away his position and blessings as the firstborn, because he could not control his hunger. In the same way, you can also give away your valuable treasure if you do not learn to control yourself.

Lesson: Learn to control yourself.

MEMORY VERSE: *Don't be afraid, for I am with you. Don't be discouraged, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand. ISAIAH 41:10, NLT*

God is always with His children: through "thick and thin"; through the storms; through difficult times and through challenging moments. He is ever ready to stay with you through any trouble till His glory is revealed. God always reassures us to never be afraid of "tomorrow", for He holds the future in His hands.

Allow God to strengthen you during any difficult time and be hopeful that all will be well. You may be faced with poor academic performance, but be encouraged that, very soon, it will be over. Have faith that your future is secured, despite your poor academic performance. God is with you and He will ensure that your situation becomes better.

Lesson: Always know that your future is secured, because God is with you.

THEME: SEEKING PROTECTION FROM GOD

TOPIC: GOD'S CONSOLATION IS ASSURED IN YOUR ANXIETY

BIBLE PASSAGE: PSALM 94:17-19

MEMORY VERSE: *When doubts filled my mind, your comfort gave me renewed hope and cheer. PSALM 94:19, NLT*

Never be anxious about whatever you face. God is always right there with you in times of trouble and loss. You may be feeling sad as a result of losing your position in class, but God is still there to comfort and encourage you. His promises for you are sure and true.

THEME: SEEKING PROTECTION FROM GOD TOPIC: GOD BLESSES WITH A SOUND MIND

BIBLE PASSAGE: 2 TIMOTHY 1:6-7
